Town Mayor's Announcements

The Town Mayor gave details of events she had attended over the last two months including the Mayor of Allerdale's Inauguration night, the Mayor of Keswick's Civic Service, the junior schools football tournament presentation at Broughton School, the Annual General Meeting of the Association of Towns Awarded the Europe Prize in Darmstadt in Germany, a Town Twinning meeting, her own Civic Service in All Saints Church, the Cockermouth Children's Carnival, a Castlegate Singers & Flimby Male Voice Choir concert, the Fairfield Festival of Art, the Rotary presentation of slides of old Cockermouth, a reception for the Chernobyl Children, Dearham Carnival, a storytelling event in Victoria Hall, the official opening of the Mike Wilde Eco Centre, a Cockermouth Speakers Club event, a party for the Chernobyl Children and a Cockermouth Rotary Club Supper and Theatre event.

Minutes

13387 RESOLVED

“that the Minutes of the Meeting of the Cockermouth Town Council held in the Council Chamber, Town Hall, Cockermouth on Wednesday 18th June 2008 be confirmed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman”.

Attendance by Police

Sgt. J. Charge was in attendance and gave the Police report for the past month indicating the Carnival in town had gone well with no incidents but complaints had been received that bus companies had not been properly informed when he indicated the Police would liaise with the Carnival organisers next year to ensure this was done.

He went on to report that 4 males had been arrested, charged and were now in custody in connection with a burglary in town. A further 3 males had also been arrested in connection with attempted fraud allegations and had since been bailed pending further enquiries. Two people had been arrested for breaching ASBOs in town and one who was also arrested for breach of bail and criminal damage was now in prison. A road rage

incident had also occurred in Station Street when a male was attacked by the driver of another vehicle but had been caught on CCTV and had now been charged for the assault.

Sgt Charge indicated the Dispersal Order was continuing in the town centre and to date 33 persons had been subject of a dispersal under the Order. The Police are continuing to try and keep staffing for the Order in place with assistance from the Special Constabulary and were hoping to extend it.

As far as the Cockermouth Rock Festival was concerned preparations were under way with Police being on the site throughout the event. The Police would also be involved in Broughton carnival.

The Police had again been receiving complaints from residents about the anti social use of the picnic bench near Derwentside Gardens. The Police had been responding to calls but would ask once again for consideration to be giving to re-siting it to a more suitable location and he further indicated residents had indicated they would be willing to help pay for the re-siting costs.

As far as crime statistics were concerned over the period there had also been a total of 41 crime incidents and 27 arrests in connection with public order offences, possession of cannabis, theft of a motor vehicle, theft from a motor vehicle, assault, drunk & disorderly, breach of bail, breach of ASBO, burglary, fraud, criminal damage, drink driving and theft.

Sgt. Charge then referred to a recent meeting at the Eco Centre of the proposed Rural Safety Group which had been attended by Police representatives, residents of the Windmill Lane and Castlegate Drive areas, representatives of All Saints School and Cockermouth School and Cllr. Alan Smith. PS Farnworth from the Community Safety Team had given a presentation to the meeting about rural safety groups and problem solving and a further meeting would be held on 4th August at the Town Hall if that was possible to allocate roles and responsibilities (the Eco Centre was not available due to school holidays). The forming of such a group would lead to increased funding opportunities and could assist with the purchase of a speed indication device. He further indicated there was an ongoing speed enforcement campaign targeting trunk roads but also in town.

In conclusion Sgt Charge indicated that during the period the Police had responded to 20 road traffic collisions, 19 of which were damage only incidents with one involving minor injury. There had also been 6 Mountain rescue calls when unfortunately one had involved a fatality, two people had been reported missing but had been located safe and well and the Police had dealt with one sudden death with no suspicious circumstances and 3 incidents when members of the public had collapsed in the street.

Cllr. A. Smith then referred to the possible formation of the Rural Safety Group and the next meeting in the Town Hall on 4th August when he hoped representatives of the Town Council and Allerdale Borough Council would be present. He further indicated Cllr. Nicholson had secured £500 from Neighbourhood Forum towards the provision of the speed indication device and he hoped the Town Council would agree to contribute £1,000. Money was also being sought via the Allerdale Crime Reduction Partnership. Another member then brought the attention of the Police to complaints concerning youths

congregating in the cemetery and causing problems as a result of alcohol, drugs and intimidation and abusive behaviour. Sgt Charge indicated the Police were aware of the situation which was being addressed within staffing capabilities and would give a report on progress to the next meeting.

Sgt. Charge left the meeting at 7.20 p.m.

Possible Contribution to Cost of Speed Indication Device

A discussion then followed on the possible provision of a speed indication device for the town when Cllr. A. Smith again indicated £500 had been promised from Neighbourhood Forum and an application for help with funding had been made to the Crime Reduction Partnership. The Council had a provision of £1,000 in the budget for CCTV/Speed Cameras but a member indicated she was against the full £1,000 budget being allocated to the provision of a speed indication device as some funds may be required later in the year in connection with CCTV cameras.
