We estimated that around 14,000 people came to visit and participate in the 2008 event, and it was an honour to think that we had put so much enjoyment into people's lives that day.

## Inaugural lunch for the Georgian Fair 2010 - 3 May 2009

For the 2010 Georgian Fair we are trying to raise awareness of the Georgian Fair well in advance and decided to hold a lunch event - drinks and canapés in Wordsworth House, to the accompaniment of musicians on and around the harpsichord, followed by lunch in The Trout Hotel, with a menu with a very Georgian Theme, followed by a brief presentation of our plans, and an auction of promises kindly donated by local individuals and business, to help us with our fund-raising efforts. We do hope that all Friends who were able to attend the lunch enjoy the event.

We would like to thank, in particular, Sue Eccles of The Trout Hotel, who was the one who suggested the concept of the event to us.

We hope that this will be the first of a number of events at which we participate in some way, so that we can raise the town's awareness and anticipation of the 2010 Georgian Fair.

## Maypole dancing

The Georgian Fair in 2010 will take place on 1 May, May Day. We thought that it would be fitting if we could arrange for there to be maypole dancing at the Georgian Fair as well as other forms of entertainment. We are pleased to say that we have been offered a maypole. We will therefore be arranging to inspect the maypole, the arrange for it to be transported and rehoused, as well as refurbished in good time before May 2010. We will also be liaising with local schools, dance clubs and after school clubs to see if they will be interested in learning maypole dancing, so that we can have a maypole display at the next Georgian Fair. 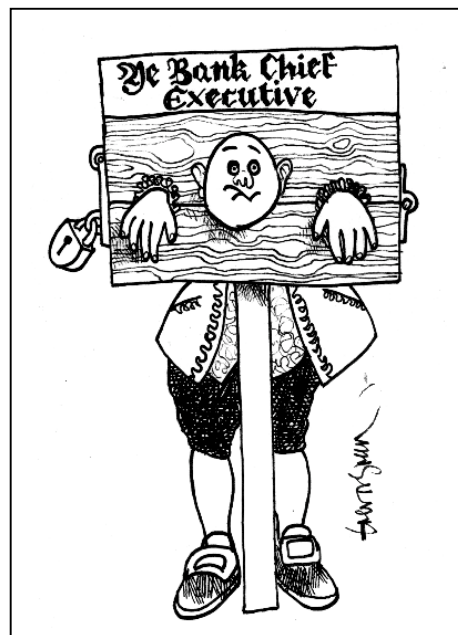
