If you attended the street market in South Street on the late Bank Holiday Monday in May, you will probably have seen us with one of the sedan chairs with an interesting addition of wheels to make it more portable (don't worry - they will be removed for the sedan chair races at the Georgian Fair next year) handing out St George's flags to the children and telling everyone who would listen to us about next year's event. We managed to convince one of the street traders that

he should attend the Georgian Fair, and spoke to one of the teachers from Cockermouth School, which has resulted in the school agreeing to participate more in the next event. This is in addition to their making us a pillory for use at the Georgian Fair, but which we hope should be ready for the Cockermouth lights switchon in November.

We also took the sedan chair in the procession for the Children's Carnival on 20 Again, we were in Iune. costume, but this time accompanied by Arran, who also dressed up in costume and did a great job in handing out our postcards advertising the Geoergian Fair and seeking new Friends. However, we also intend to be selling cakes made to Georgian recipes. Come along and see our Plane Cakes, Vinegar Cake (remember the vinegar pie at the lunch on 3 May?), and Little Cakes, to name but a few.

In addition to all that, we are pleased to say that we have ordered some Georgian Fair, Fairtrade cotton shopping bags which should arrive in time for the Show. Just the thing to carry around for those impulse purchases to try to reduce the use of plastic bags. These will be retailing at £1.50, but, as promised, Friends will be entitled to a discount on Georgian Fair merchandise, and the price for Friends will be £1.25.
