However, the Times & Star correctly stated that we were taking a stall at the Cockermouth Show on 1 August, and that's what we did. We were very pleased to see Friends and other people who had read the Times & Star article and welcomed the opportunity to

speak to the people who were kind enough to come along to our stall and see us. In particular, we were pleased to welcome new Friends and to receive offers of help. Those of you who came along will have seen us handing out our publicity postcards, and doing quite a busy trade in our Georgian recipe cakes and biscuits, and our new Fair Trade shopping bags. The cakes had completely sold out by mid-afternoon, and we raised just over £166.10 on the day which will be put towards next year's Georgian Fair.

We also spoke to a number of the stall-holders at the Show, who expressed interest in attending next year's Georgian Fair.

The Times & Star did follow up on the original article, and you may well have seen the article on the front page of the 7 August edition which highlighted that we were delighted with the response received. After the Cockermouth Show, we were delighted to be contacted by Gill Greenhalgh, the chairwoman of Voices Dot Com, who you probably know is a singing group based in and around Cockermouth.

Voices Dot Com would like part of the entertainment at next year's Georgian Fair, singing traditional English songs around the town in costume. We are very pleased to accept their offer.
