Our patrons, Lord & Lady Judd, the Cockermouth Chamber Trade and many individuals have expressed the hope that the Georgian Fair will go ahead and we intend to make it happen.

We envisage that a number of the venues may change this year, but will work together with all interested parties to make sure that the events go ahead, somewhere in the town.

The organisation of this year's event is not going to be straightforward, and the task ahead of us is challenging, but with the support we have received already and more which I am sure will be forthcoming, we are determined to make the Georgian Fair a day for us all to enjoy.

### Maypole dancing

In preparation, the maypole which will be used for the maypole dancing on 1 May is currently being refurbished. We also have a practice maypole and have held sessions for teachers to learn how to teach maypole dancing.

#### **Pillory**

Pupils at Cockermouth School have made a pillory for us. Our original intention had been to give it its first outing at the lights switch-on in November, but clearly that was not to be. We will make sure that it is on display and being used – any volunteers to stand in it? – on 1 May.

### Costume-making workshops

You may also have seen the posters for our costume-making workshops, to be fortnightly on Tuesday evenings at 7.30 pm at the Kirkgate 2 Centre from February onwards. These are at no cost to participants, and we hope that all our Friends, and as many townsfolk as possible will dress up for the event. doesn't have to be an intricate costume - we have suggestions and simple tips for everyone to make their own costume.

#### Other matters:

I am sure that you will be aware that Wordsworth House was a victim of the November floods. Undaunted, however, Alex Morgan, Acting Custodian, assures me that they will be reopening as usual on 13 March.

This is what she has sent me:

AsWilliam child. Wordsworth loved to play and read on the banks of the River Derwent, which flows past the famous terrace walk. In his masterwork The Prelude, he fondly remembers it as a "murmuring stream". OnNovember 19, that same river filled Wordsworth House's garden, cellars, visitor reception and shop.

Pay a visit this season and see how the damage has been restored. Watch the Trust's skilled masons rebuilding William's terrace.

A new exhibition details the dramatic events in Cockermouth on the day of the flood, the amazing rescue operation and tells how Wordsworth House and the town as a whole have fared since. Follow the flood trail around the house and garden to find out exactly how high the water reached.

Wordsworth House is offering free entry throughout the season to Friends of the Georgian Fair, and on May 1, entry will be free to anyone with a CA13 postcode.

We are very grateful to Wordsworth House for making this kind offer to Friends of the Georgian Fair, and I'm sure that, like me, you will wish to take them up on this offer and have a look at this new exhibition.
